May brought about the end of the year activities. We graduated a wonderful group of 8th graders and had a great end of the year closing service.

We ended the school year with 128 students, which was more than budgeted for.

The school year began with 126 students and although we have added and lost some in these past few months, we have settled in at 124, which is more than budgeted. We are back to normal with operations.

The staff is working on making a new social studies selection for the following school year. We continue to have a quarterly family activity day/night. We also have a monthly E.A.T. (Eat Around Town) night at a local eatery where the school gets a small percentage of the earnings from those who bring in a coupon.

Volleyball, Archery, and Basketball are all activities underway or have finished their season. Our student leadership group has overseen the collection of canned goods for Redeemer Lutheran Food Pantry and or classroom door decorating contest. Carols by Candle Light was excellent as very well attended.

The year ahead will bring the challenge of finding a principal as Mr. Wrucke will be retiring in the summer. Mrs. Lehenbauer also will not continue in her current part-time roll.
